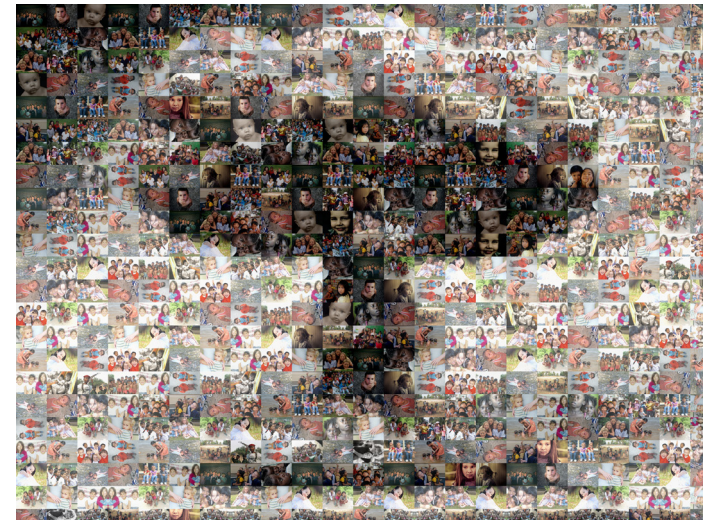
Faslane main gate is situated at a roundabout.

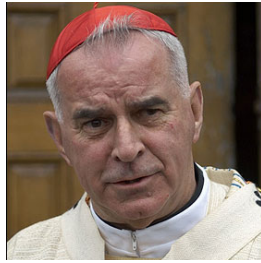
WHAT WILL HAPPEN?

There will be a short act of worship with singing, prayers for peace, followed by a picnic. Bring food to share. Tea, coffee and juice will be provided.

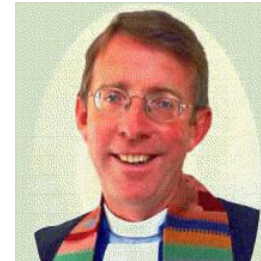
WHO IS IT FOR?

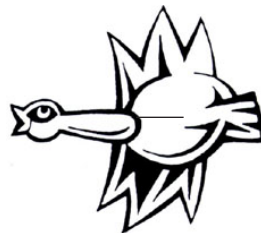

Threatening others with annihilation runs counter to God's will for our world.

Nuclear weapons are about posturing – not about defence. Trident is unusable. Most countries do not rely on nuclear weapons for their defence.

As signatories to the Non-Proliferation Treaty our country has an obligation to take steps to remove these weapons – not build a new generation of bombs.

It is hypocrisy to tell other nations they cannot have a nuclear programme when we are increasing and developing our own.

The issue of converting from Trident-related jobs is not as complicated as some politicians try to suggest. The vast majority of people at Faslane are employed in non-nuclear related work.

At a time of deficit, with huge cuts planned for public services, it is madness to spend £100 billion on unusable weapons.
